

**ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
BETWEEN**

**The Board of Trustees on behalf of Johnson County Community College
and the Curators of the University of Missouri
on behalf of the University of Missouri-Kansas City
The College of Arts and Sciences**

OVERVIEW:

This formal program articulation agreement is made and entered into by the Curators of the University of Missouri on behalf of the University of Missouri-Kansas City, hereinafter referred to as UMKC, and the Board of Trustees of Johnson County Community College, hereinafter referred to as JCCC. By this agreement, JCCC and UMKC express a shared commitment to increasing opportunities for student access to and success in higher education. By clarifying transfer policies and procedures which assure articulation between programs, the institutions seek to assist students in making a seamless transfer from the associate to the baccalaureate degree.

PURPOSE:

This agreement provides students who have earned an Associate of Arts in Liberal Arts from JCCC the opportunity to complete the following Bachelor degrees at UMKC:

Any JCCC student who has earned an Associate of Arts is guaranteed that UMKC will accept designated, degree-specific freshman and sophomore credits and general education credits and will apply such to the Bachelor degree in a manner consistent with the treatment of native students.

CONDITIONS OF TRANSFER:

Section I: Admissions and Matriculation

JCCC students maintaining continuous enrollment under this agreement will be afforded the same treatment and protection as UMKC native students enrolled under a specific catalog; JCCC students will not be disadvantaged in the transfer process. JCCC, upon request of students, will provide verification of completed courses to UMKC through its Office of Admissions. The transcript of students transferring from JCCC will be evaluated by representatives from the College of Arts and Sciences and Records and Registration Office at UMKC.

Section II: Transfer of Credit

A maximum of 84 credit hours will be accepted by UMKC from JCCC to be applied to the Bachelor of Arts in American Studies.

A maximum of 84 credit hours will be accepted by UMKC from JCCC to be applied to the Bachelor of Arts in Art.

A maximum of 84 credit hours will be accepted by UMKC from JCCC to be applied to the Bachelor of Arts in Art History.

A maximum of 84 credit hours will be accepted by UMKC from JCCC to be applied to the Bachelor of Arts in Chemistry.

A maximum of 84 credit hours will be accepted by UMKC from JCCC to be applied to the Bachelor of Arts in Communication Studies.

A maximum of 84 credit hours will be accepted by UMKC from JCCC to be applied to the Bachelor of Arts in Criminal Justice.

A maximum of 84 credit hours will be accepted by UMKC from JCCC to be applied to the Bachelor of Arts in Economics.

A maximum of 84 credit hours will be accepted by UMKC from JCCC to be applied to the Bachelor of Arts in English.

A maximum of 84 credit hours will be accepted by UMKC from JCCC to be applied to the Bachelor of Arts in English- Creative Writing Emphasis.

A maximum of 84 credit hours will be accepted by UMKC from JCCC to be applied to the Bachelor of Arts in Environmental Studies.

A maximum of 84 credit hours will be accepted by UMKC from JCCC to be applied to the Bachelor of Arts in French.

A maximum of 84 credit hours will be accepted by UMKC from JCCC to be applied to the Bachelor of Arts in Geography.

A maximum of 84 credit hours will be accepted by UMKC from JCCC to be applied to the Bachelor of Arts in Geology.

A maximum of 84 credit hours will be accepted by UMKC from JCCC to be applied to the Bachelor of Arts in German.

A maximum of 84 credit hours will be accepted by UMKC from JCCC to be applied to the Bachelor of Arts in History.

A maximum of 84 credit hours will be accepted by UMKC from JCCC to be applied to the Bachelor Arts in Mathematics and Statistics.

A maximum of 84 credit hours will be accepted by UMKC from JCCC to be applied to the Bachelor of Arts in Philosophy.

A maximum of 84 credit hours will be accepted by UMKC from JCCC to be applied to the Bachelor of Arts in Physics.

A maximum of 84 credit hours will be accepted by UMKC from JCCC to be applied to the Bachelor of Arts in Political Science.

A maximum of 84 credit hours will be accepted by UMKC from JCCC to be applied to the Bachelor of Arts in Psychology.

A maximum of 84 credit hours will be accepted by UMKC from JCCC to be applied to the Bachelor of Arts in Sociology.

A maximum of 84 credit hours will be accepted by UMKC from JCCC to be applied to the Bachelor of Arts in Spanish.

A maximum of 84 credit hours will be accepted by UMKC from JCCC to be applied to the Bachelor of Arts in Studio Art.

A maximum of 84 credit hours will be accepted by UMKC from JCCC to be applied to the Bachelor of Arts in Theater.

A maximum of 84 credit hours will be accepted by UMKC from JCCC to be applied to the Bachelor of Arts in Urban Planning.

A maximum of 84 credit hours will be accepted by UMKC from JCCC to be applied to the Bachelor of Arts in Urban Studies.

A maximum of 84 credit hours will be accepted by UMKC from JCCC to be applied to the Bachelor of Arts of Liberal Arts.

A maximum of 84 credit hours will be accepted by UMKC from JCCC to be applied to the Bachelor of Science in Chemistry.

A maximum of 84 credit hours will be accepted by UMKC from JCCC to be applied to the Bachelor of Science in Environmental Studies.

A maximum of 84 credit hours will be accepted by UMKC from JCCC to be applied to the Bachelor of Science in Geology.

A maximum of 84 credit hours will be accepted by UMKC from JCCC to be applied to the Bachelor of Science in Mathematics and Statistics.

A maximum of 84 credit hours will be accepted by UMKC from JCCC to be applied to the Bachelor of Science in Physics.

Transfer students from JCCC, upon acceptance into the designated program at UMKC, will have junior standing at UMKC.

To be admissible to the College of Arts and Sciences programs, a student must meet UMKC Admissions requirements. At the time this document is being executed, UMKC has a minimum 30 hour residency requirement, and students are required to earn a GPA of at least a 2.00.

Section III: Program Plan



TERMS OF AGREEMENT:


This agreement is made and entered into in the academic year 2009-2010 and remains in force unless changed in writing by mutual agreement of both parties. The agreement may be amended at any time by either party and must remain consistent with respective College of Arts and Sciences and JCCC degree requirements. Should either party desire to discontinue this agreement, advance notification of two years will be required.
