

**ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
BETWEEN**

**The Board of Trustees on behalf of Johnson County Community College
and the Curators of the University of Missouri
on behalf of the University of Missouri-Kansas City
Conservatory of Music and Dance**

OVERVIEW:

This formal program articulation agreement is made and entered into by the Curators of the University of Missouri on behalf of the University of Missouri-Kansas City, hereinafter referred to as UMKC, and the Board of Trustees of Johnson County Community College, hereinafter referred to as JCCC. By this agreement, JCCC and UMKC express a shared commitment to increasing opportunities for student access to and success in higher education. By clarifying transfer policies and procedures which assure articulation between programs, the institutions seek to assist students in making a seamless transfer from the associate to the baccalaureate degree.

PURPOSE:

This agreement provides students who have earned an Associate of Arts in Liberal Arts from JCCC the opportunity to complete a Bachelor of Arts in Music at UMKC. This agreement also provides that any JCCC student who has earned an Associate of Arts Degree is guaranteed that UMKC will accept designated freshman and sophomore music credits and general education credits and will apply such to the Bachelor degree in a manner consistent with the treatment of native students.

CONDITIONS OF TRANSFER:

Section I: Admissions and Matriculation

JCCC students maintaining continuous enrollment under this agreement will be afforded the same treatment and protection as UMKC native students enrolled under a specific catalog. JCCC students will not be disadvantaged in the transfer process or auditions. JCCC, upon request of students, will provide verification of completed courses to UMKC through its Office of Admissions. The transcript of students transferring from JCCC will be evaluated by representatives from the Conservatory of Music and Dance and Records and Registration Office at UMKC.

Section II: Transfer of Credit

A maximum of 72 credit hours will be accepted by UMKC from JCCC to be applied to the Bachelor of Arts in Music.

Transfer students from JCCC, upon acceptance into the designated program at UMKC, will have junior standing at UMKC.

To be admissible to the Conservatory of Music and Dance programs, a student must have completed all prerequisites. At the time this document is being executed, students are

required to complete 60 hours of coursework at UMKC and University of Missouri GPA of at least a 2.00.

Section III: Program Plan



TERMS OF AGREEMENT:

This agreement is made and entered into in the academic year 2009-2010 and remains in force unless changed in writing by mutual agreement of both parties. The agreement may be amended at any time by either party and must remain consistent with respective Conservatory of Music and Dance and JCCC degree requirements. Should either party desire to discontinue this agreement, advance notification of two years will be required.


SIGNATURES:


