

**ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
Kansas City Kansas Community College and the Curators of the University
of Missouri on behalf of the
University of Missouri-Kansas City**

OVERVIEW:

This formal program articulation agreement is made and entered into by the Curators of the University of Missouri on behalf of the University of Missouri-Kansas City, hereinafter referred to as UMKC, and the Community College District of Kansas City Kansas, hereinafter referred to as KCKCC. By this agreement KCKCC and UMKC express a shared commitment to increasing opportunities for student access to and success in higher education. By clarifying transfer policies and procedures which assure articulation between programs, the institutions seek to assist students in making a seamless transfer from the associate to the baccalaureate degree.

PURPOSE:

This agreement provides students who have earned an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science from KCKCC the opportunity to complete a Bachelor of Art or a Bachelor of Science (BA/BS) at UMKC. The specific degree articulation agreements provide a roadmap for transfer and should be followed by students and their advisors.

CONDITIONS OF TRANSFER:

Section I: Admissions and Matriculation

KCKCC students maintaining continuous enrollment under this agreement will be afforded the same treatment and protection as UMKC native students enrolled under a specific catalog.

Criteria for acceptance into UMKC will be the same for transfer as for native students.

KCKCC, upon request of students, will provide verification of completed courses to UMKC through its Office of Admissions and Records.

The transcript of students transferring from KCKCC will be evaluated by representatives from the Registrar's Office at UMKC.

Section II: Transfer of Credit

Any Kansas City Kansas Community College student who has earned an Associate of Art or an Associate of Science is guaranteed that UMKC will accept designated freshman and sophomore credits and all general education credits and will apply such to the Bachelor degree in a manner consistent with the treatment of native students.
