

**ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
Metropolitan Community College and the Curators of the University
of Missouri on behalf of the
University of Missouri-Kansas City
College of Arts and Sciences**

OVERVIEW:

This formal program articulation agreement is made and entered into by the Curators of the University of Missouri on behalf of the University of Missouri-Kansas City, hereinafter referred to as UMKC, and the Metropolitan Community College District of Kansas City Missouri, hereinafter referred to as MCC. By this agreement MCC and UMKC express a shared commitment to increasing opportunities for student access to and success in higher education. By clarifying transfer policies and procedures which assure articulation between programs, the institutions seek to assist students in making a seamless transfer from the associate to the baccalaureate degree.

PURPOSE:

This agreement provides students who have earned an Associate of Arts or the Associate of Science from MCC the opportunity to complete a Bachelor of Art or a Bachelor of Science (BA/BS) at UMKC. Any Metropolitan Community College student who has earned an Associate of Art or an Associate of Science is guaranteed that UMKC will accept designated freshman and sophomore credits and all general education credits and will apply such to the Bachelor degree in a manner consistent with the treatment of native students.

CONDITIONS OF TRANSFER:

Section I: Admissions and Matriculation

MCC students maintaining continuous enrollment under this agreement will be afforded the same treatment and protection as UMKC native students enrolled under a specific catalog.

Criteria for acceptance into UMKC will be the same for transfer as for native students. MCC, upon request of students, will provide verification of completed courses to UMKC through its Office of Admissions and Records.

The transcript of students transferring from MCC will be evaluated by representatives from the College of Arts and Sciences and Registrar's Office at UMKC.

Section II: Transfer of Credit

Transfer students from MCC, upon acceptance into the designated program at UMKC, will have junior standing at UMKC.

To be admissible to the College of Arts and Sciences, student must have completed all prerequisites. To be admissible to the College of Arts and Sciences, student must have

completed all prerequisites. At the same time this document is being executed, these requirements include 60 hours of coursework at UMKC and University of Missouri GPA of at least a 2.00.

Section III: Program Plan


Students falling under this program articulation agreement will be responsible for successfully completing the following requirements for each degree category.

TERMS OF AGREEMENT:


This agreement is made and entered into in the academic year 2007-2008 and remains in force unless changed in writing by mutual agreement of both parties. The agreement may be amended at any time by either party and must remain consistent with respective to the College of Arts and Sciences and MCC degree requirements. Should either party desire to discontinue this agreement, advance notification of two years will be required.



***Foreign Language Requirement:**

Foreign language is not required for any Bachelor of Science degree at UMKC.

UMKC BACHELOR OF SCIENCE DEGREE – ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES

UMKC requires that BS majors in Environmental Studies complete the core courses (ENVS 110R/110L, ENVS 210, ENVS 499WI, BIOL 108/108L, BIOL 109/109L, CHEM 211/211L, CHEM 212R/212LR, GEOG 215, GEOG 250 or 251, and MATH 235); and four courses from those electives listed in the requirements below. For this latter requirement, students must take at least one course from each of three areas: natural sciences (NS), social sciences (SS), and ethics/jurisprudence/culture (E). To complete a BS degree, students must complete a minimum of 60 credit hours of combined math and science courses. For those students that have completed the Associate in Arts degree, the remaining general education course requirements are: passage of the Written English Proficiency Test, a 300/400 level Writing Intensive course (ENVS 499WI), and a 300/400 interdisciplinary "cluster course." A Writing Intensive course from MCC will not fulfill the upper-level Writing Intensive requirement at UMKC. Courses taken at MCC that are equivalent to 300/400-level courses at UMKC will not be considered upper level and will not count towards the 36 minimum upper level hours that are required. The BS in Environmental Studies requires 120 minimum credit hours, including 36 credit hours at the 300/400 level.

*Foreign Language Requirement:

A student who has completed 2 years of the same foreign language while in high school is exempt from Foreign Language 110 (MCC 101). A student who has completed 4 years of the same foreign language while in high school is exempt from Foreign Language 110 (MCC 101) and Foreign language 120 (MCC 102). The foreign language courses may be taken at MCC to fulfill AA requirements or taken at UMKC to fulfill BA requirements.

UMKC BACHELOR OF ARTS DEGREE – ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES

UMKC requires a minimum of 35 credit hours of courses for the Environmental Studies BA major. Students must complete the core courses (ENVS 110R/110L, CHEM 160, ENVS 210, and ENVS 499WI); three courses from ECON 420, GEOG 203, GEOG 317, GEOG 406, HIST 364R, PHIL 370, and UPD 432; and four courses from those Elective Courses in Related Disciplines listed below. For this latter requirement, students must take at least one course from each of three areas: natural sciences (NS), social sciences (SS), and ethics/jurisprudence/culture (E). For those students that have completed the Associate in Arts degree, the remaining general education course requirements are: three semesters of the same foreign language (if not already taken for AA), passage of the Written English Proficiency Test, a 300/400 level Writing Intensive course (ENVS 499WI), and a 300/400 interdisciplinary "cluster course." A Writing Intensive course from MCC will not fulfill the upper-level Writing Intensive requirement at UMKC. Courses taken at MCC that are equivalent to 300/400-level courses at UMKC will not be considered upper level and will not count towards the 36 minimum upper level hours that are required. The BA in Environmental Studies requires 120 minimum credit hours, including 36 hours at the 300/400 level.
