Freshman Admissions Criteria

Automatic admission

Admission to UMKC is selective and is determined by a combination of high school curriculum (see page 4 for complete listing), ACT/SAT score, class rank and GPA.

Missouri enhanced admission

Missouri residents who graduate in the top 10 percent of their class and who have met the 17 core curriculum requirement will be admissible regardless of ACT/SAT score. Those who graduate from a high school that does not rank students must have a 3.5 GPA in the 17 core curriculum classes.

Minimum Combination of Test Scores (ACT or SAT) and Class Rank Percentile

Students who have completed the required 17-unit core curriculum but who do not meet the automatic freshman acceptance outlined above should have a combination of high school class rank percentile and ACT score that meets or exceeds the table's values.

Transfer Admissions Criteria

Transfer applicants with 24 or more hours of transferable college-level coursework need an overall 2.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale in all coursework attempted at previous institutions. UMKC recalculates GPAs without using those listed on transcripts.

Applicants must have official transcripts from each college or university attended sent to the Office of Admissions before their application can be considered. If a student does not have 24 hours of transferable college-level coursework, then admission is determined by freshman admissions criteria.

Additional Factors Considered for Admission

The University seeks a heterogeneous student body reflecting diversity of race, ethnicity, age and geography (including international students). Factors given prime consideration for admission to undergraduate study are applicants previous academic success and the quality of records presented. Applicants who do not meet criteria set forth may be considered by appealing to the director of admissions.

- extensive co-curricular activities involving school, community or church;
- outstanding talent or abilities;
- the number and scope of college preparatory courses;
- evidence of marked improvement over time in high school academic record;
- significant work experience or family responsibilities;
- supporting evidence attesting to one or more of the above in the student's own handwriting (in essay form).

Special Admission Cases

Trial Admission

High school graduates who do not meet the standards for regular admission from high school may be considered for admission to UMKC on a trial basis. This enrollment is limited to 12 hours (six hours during summer), and if C grades or better are earned in those hours, the student is permitted to enroll for the following semester.

Undergraduate transfer students who do not meet the regular admission standards may complete a petition for acceptance through the Office of Admissions. Supporting documentation is required justifying additional consideration for acceptance.

GED High School Equivalency

Students can apply for admission based on the General Educational Development test after their high school class has graduated. The GED scores must be passing in each area. These students must also submit ACT-enhanced composite scores of at least 24. Students not meeting these criteria may be considered for trial admission (see above).

Non-Class Ranking High School Graduates

Any student who graduates from a Missouri high school that does not rank, but completes the 17-unit core college-preparatory curriculum and achieves a 3.5 GPA on a 4.0 scale will be admissible to UMKC. Nonresident students graduating from a high school that does not rank students must have a 3.5 GPA on a 4.0 scale and an ACT enhanced composite score of at least 24. Students not meeting these criteria may be considered for trial admission (see above).

Home Schooled Graduates

Graduates of home school programs are required to complete the 17-unit core college-preparatory curriculum. They must have a minimum ACT composite score of 24 or achieve a 3.5 GPA on a 4.0 scale in the core curriculum to be admissible

to UMKC. Students not meeting these criteria may be considered for trial admission (see Trial Admission section).

Dual High School/University Enrollment

Superior high school students can be admitted in a special student category in order to take one or two University courses concurrently with their junior or senior year of high school. Students must submit a special application for admission, available in the Office of Admissions along with a request that includes high school recommendation and written parental approval. Students are admitted based on academic standards that exceed those required for admission from high school. Admissions are limited and are subject to the space available in, and completion of prerequisites for, the desired course or courses.

Early Admission from High School

Students graduating early from high school

Superior high school students may be admitted before they graduate from high school if:

- a. They have completed all the requirements for graduation from high school but will not receive a diploma until their class graduates. Eligibility for admission is determined by the procedures established for regular admission from high school. A high school counselor or principal must certify that all graduation requirements have been met.
- b. They have not completed all requirements for graduation from high school but have submitted a test score and a high school class rank. The combination of test score and class rank will be evaluated on the basis of a standard that is higher than that used for regular admission from high school.

In either case, students are admitted on an individual basis, and an interview may be required. The following information is also required: application for admission, high school transcript, letter of recommendation from a high school principal or counselor and written parental approval.
