It should be noted that as of Fall 2000, enrollment requirements for dual-credit high school students changed, such that these students were required to enroll by the fourth week of classes.

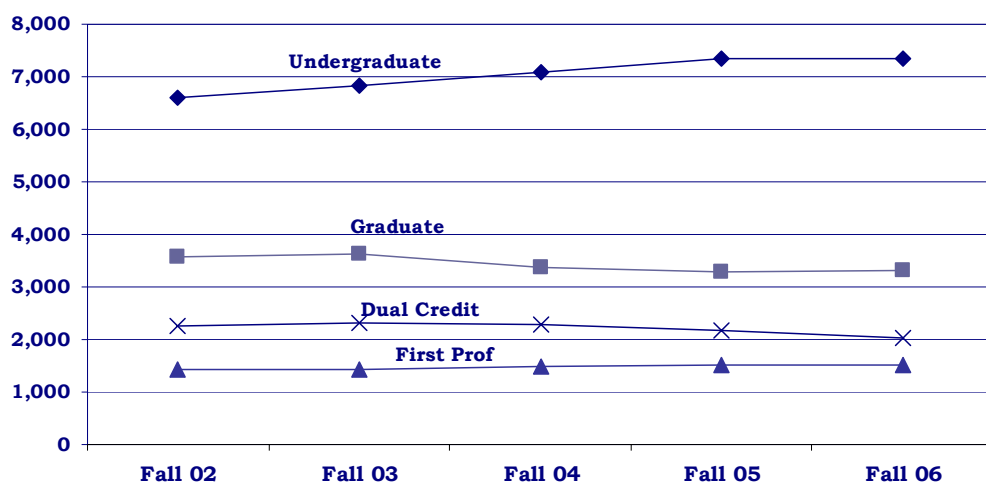

## 1. FALL HEADCOUNT

Total Fall 2006 headcount enrollment was 14,213. This was an overall increase of 2.4% from Fall 2002.

The growth has primarily been in undergraduates with a 11% increase since Fall 2002.

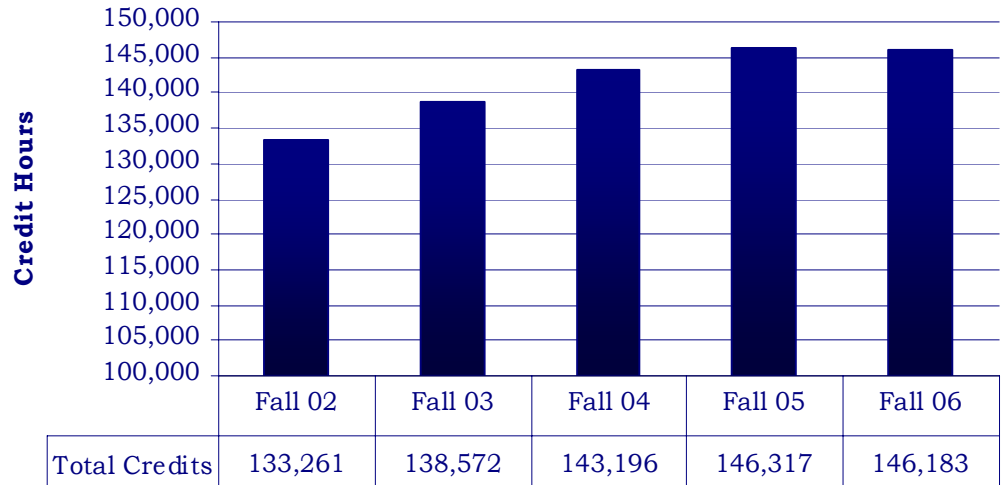
## 2. FULL-TIME EQUIVALENTS

Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) is defined by the Missouri Coordinating Board for Higher Education as 15 semester credit hours for undergraduate students, 12 semester credit hours for graduate students, and 15 semester credit hours for first-professional law students. FTE is equivalent to headcount for first-professional students in Dentistry, Medicine, and Pharmacy.

### 3. TOTAL CREDIT HOUR PRODUCTION

Credit hour production has remained steady during the last 5 years. UMKC produced 146,183 student credit hours in Fall 2006, an increase of 9.6% since Fall 2002.

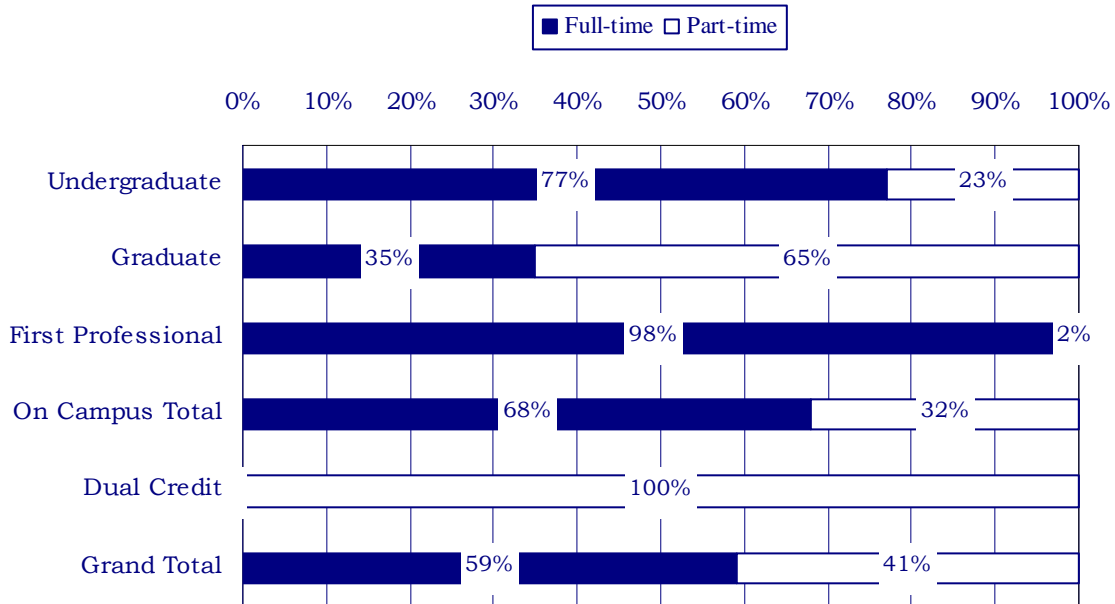

## 5. FULL- AND PART-TIME STATUS – FALL 2006

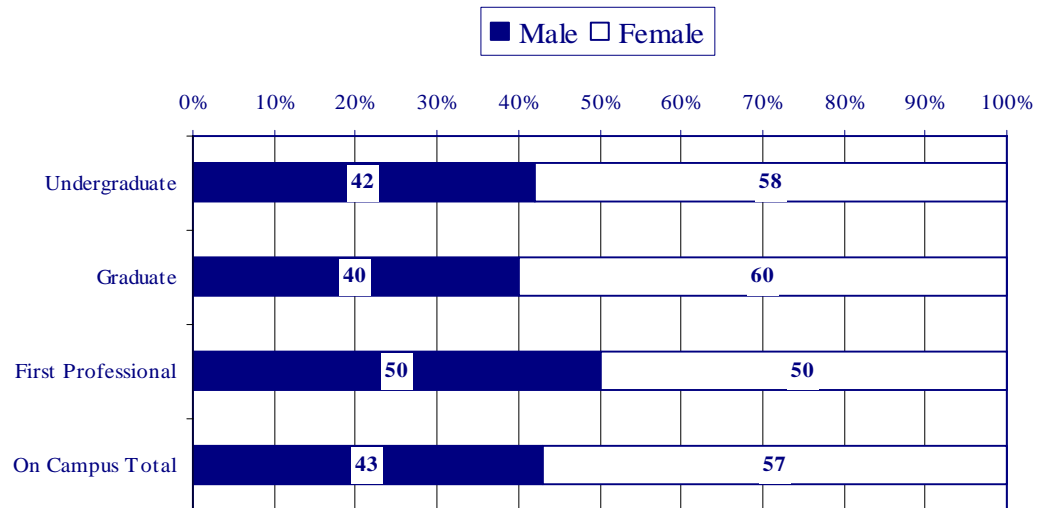
Sixty-eight percent of UMKC on-campus students (excludes dual credit students) were enrolled full-time in Fall 2006, though full-time status varies by level.

For purposes of calculating full-time status, undergraduate students must be enrolled in at least 12 credits and graduate students must be enrolled in at least 9 credits. First-professional credit thresholds vary by program.



## 6. GENDER – FALL 2006

In Fall 2006, 57% of UMKC students were female and 43% were male. UMKC enrolled more females than males at all levels but one.



## 7. AGE BY LEVEL – FALL 2006

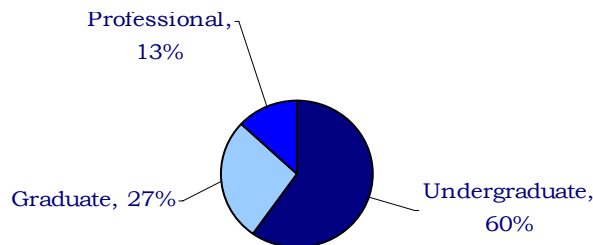
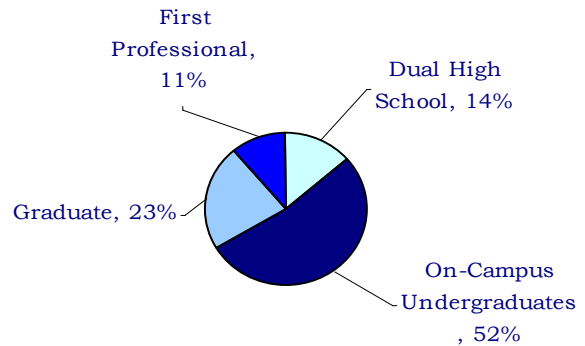
The table below shows the age distribution for UMKC students for Fall 2006. The average age for UMKC's total on campus student body is 26. When dual credit students are included the average age is 25.

## 8. ENROLLMENT BY LEVEL – FALL 2006

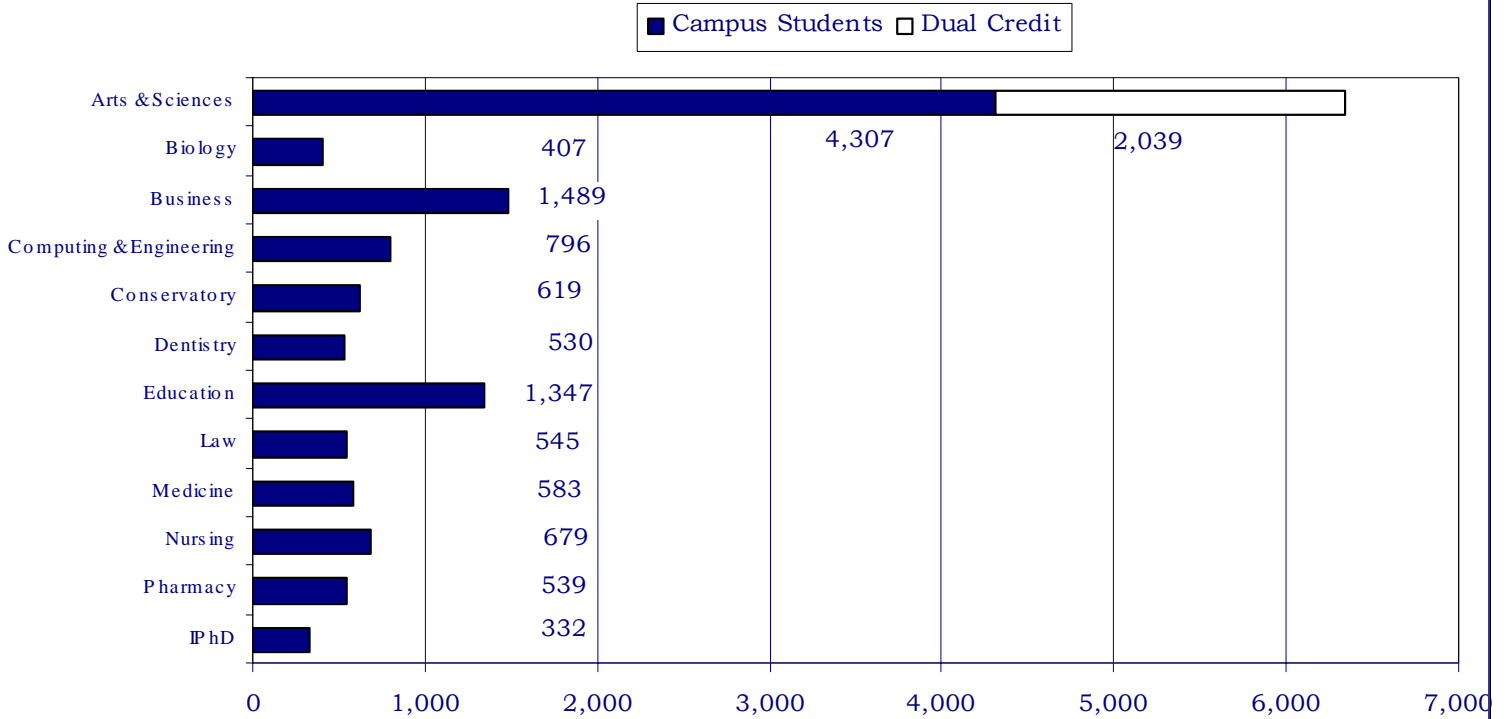
In Fall 2006, 14% of UMKC students were enrolled at the Dual Credit High School level, 52% of the on-campus students were enrolled at the undergraduate level, 23% were enrolled at the graduate level, and 11% were enrolled at the first professional level. First professional programs include Dentistry, Law, Medicine, and Pharmacy.

When Dual Credit High School students are excluded, enrollments are 60% undergraduate, 27% graduate and 13% first professional.



## 9. ENROLLMENT BY ACADEMIC UNIT

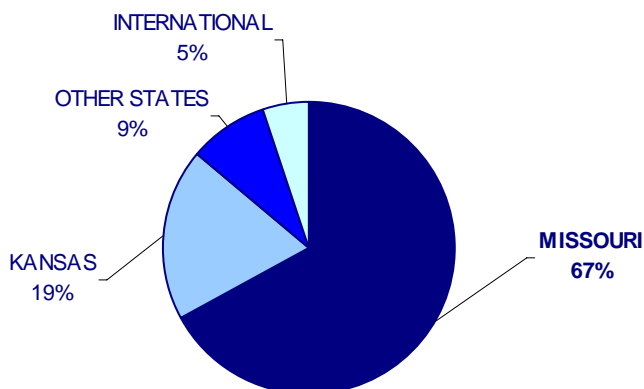
Fall 2006 headcount by academic unit is presented in the graph below. The largest academic unit is Arts & Sciences with a total of 6,346 students, including the 2,039 Dual Credit High School students.



## 10. STATE OF ORIGIN – FALL 2006

In Fall 2006 Missouri residents represented 67% of the on campus population. Another 19% were from Kansas, 9% were from other states and 5% were international.

Dual credit students are not included in the on campus population.



## 11. Undergraduates from KANSAS METRO COUNTIES

In Fall 2002 UMKC began charging undergraduate students from the Kansas Metro Counties the same educational fees as Missouri students. In Fall 2006 UMKC on-campus undergraduate enrollment from these counties was at its highest level in 7 years. Undergraduate Enrollment from the Kansas Metro Counties has grown by 46% from Fall 2002 to Fall 2006.

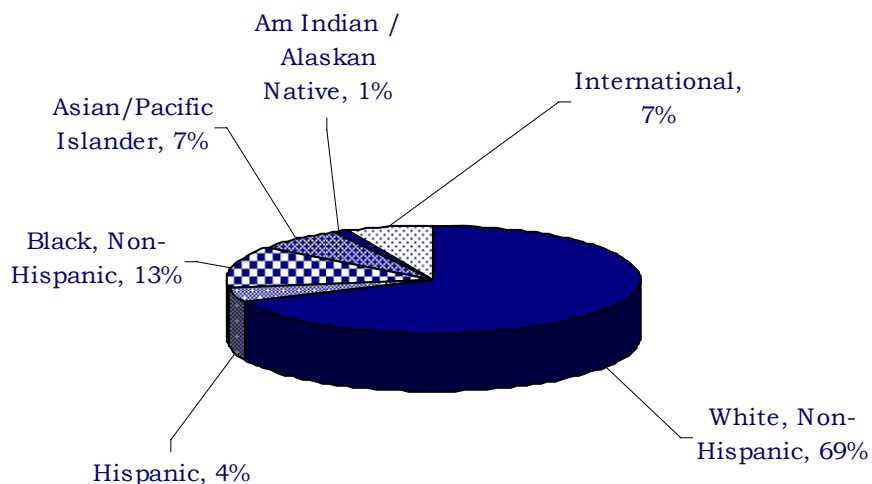

UMKC's on campus minority population is 25%.

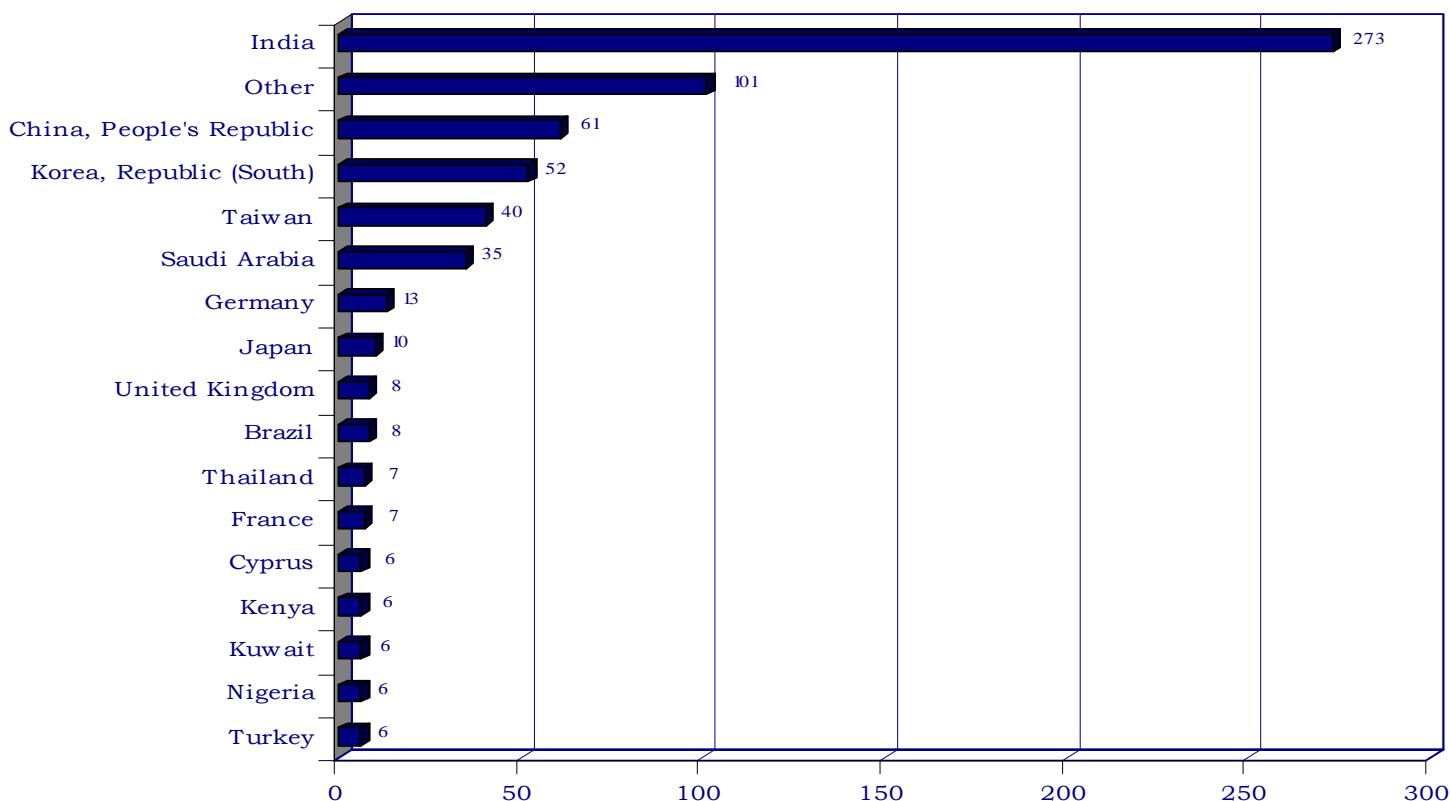
The percentages included in this figure are calculated based on the Fall 2006 on-campus enrollment where ethnicity is known.

\*Minority includes Asian/Pacific Islander, American Indian/Alaskan Native, Hispanic, and Black Non-Hispanic



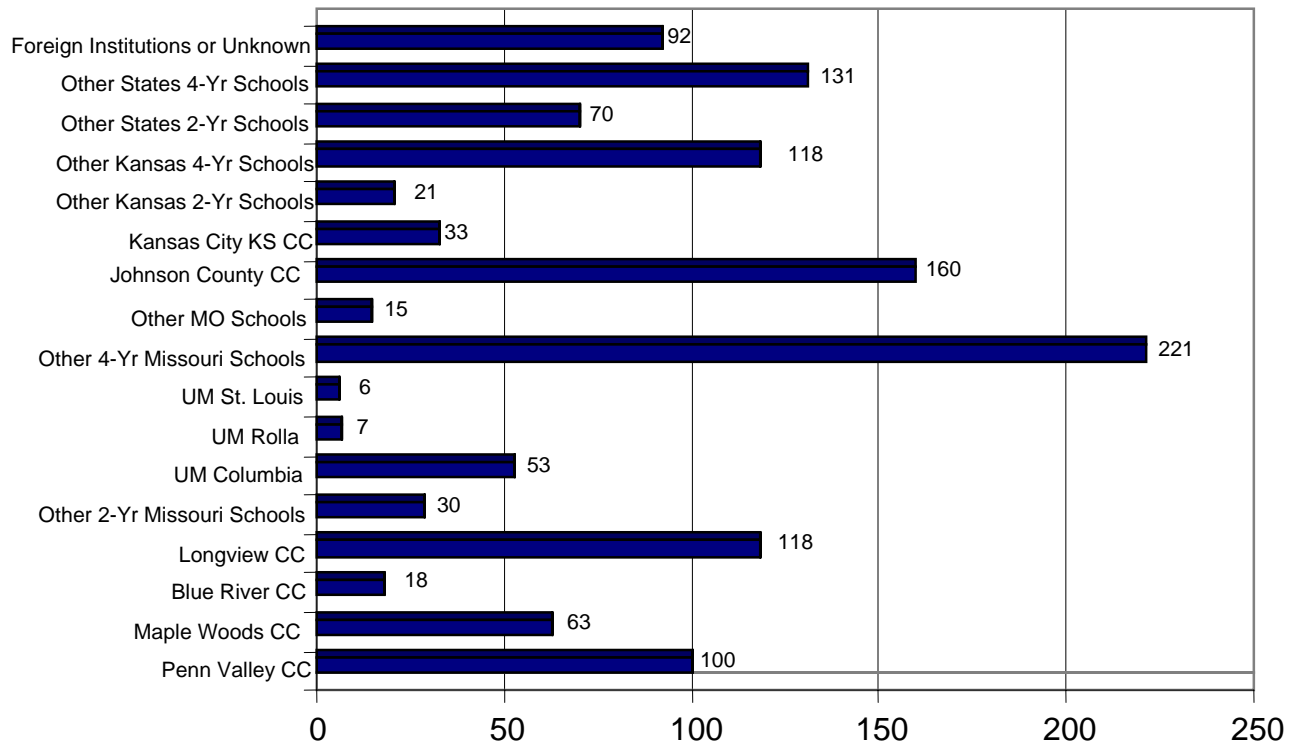
## 13. INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS – FALL 2006

A total of 748 international students enrolled at UMKC in Fall 2006, representing 63 countries. The international student enrollment represents 6% of UMKC's on campus population. The figure below shows all countries represented by at least six students at UMKC.



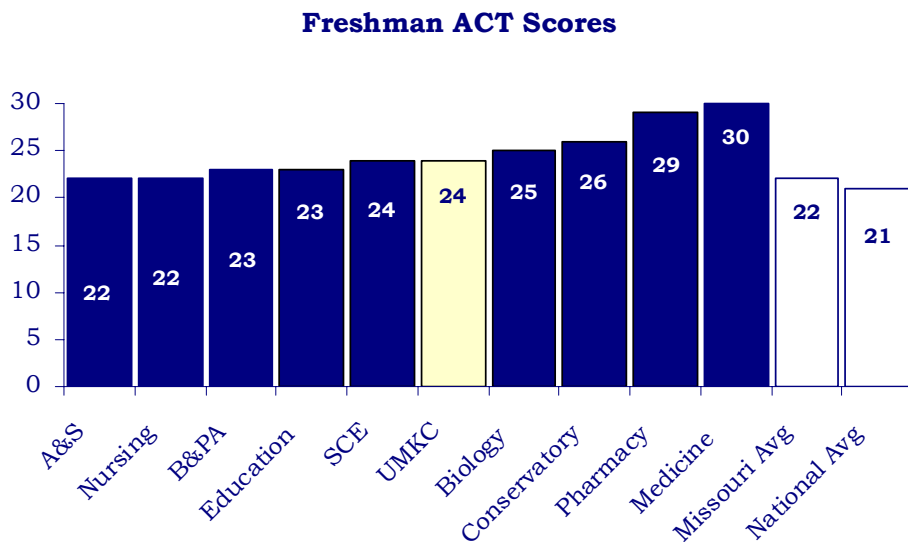
## 14. TRANSFER INSTITUTIONS – FALL 2006

The majority of new undergraduates at UMKC transfer from other institutions. There were a total of 1,256 new undergraduate transfer students in Fall 2006. Of those, 630 transferred from Missouri colleges and universities and 626 transferred from other states and countries.



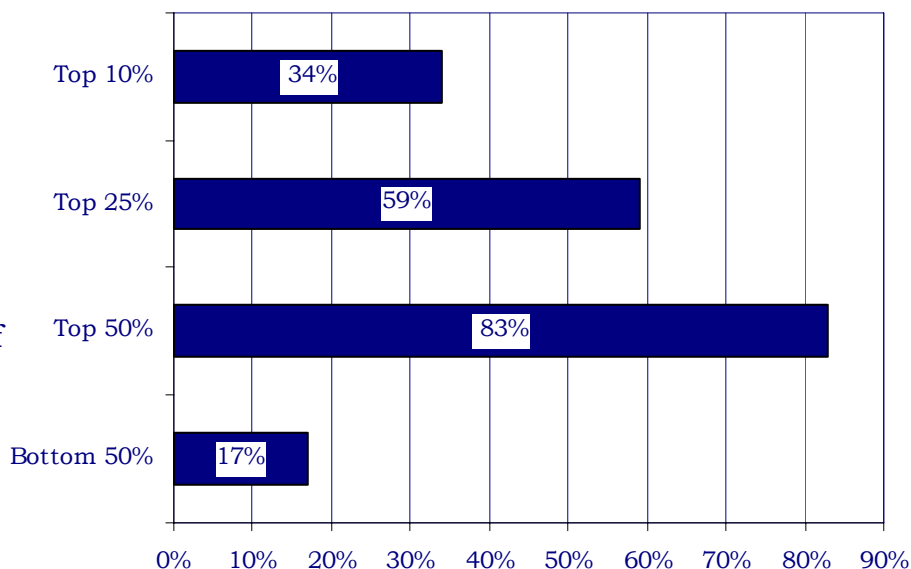
## 15. FRESHMAN ACT SCORES – FALL 2006

A total of 929 first-time full-time degree-seeking freshman students entered in Fall 2006. Of these, 885 reported their ACT score to UMKC. The average score for UMKC is 24. UMKC students performed above the Missouri average of 22 and the national average of 21.



## 16. FRESHMAN HIGH SCHOOL RANK – FALL 2006

Of the 929 first-time full-time degree-seeking freshmen, 756 reported their high school rank to UMKC. Over half of the freshmen were in the top 25% of their graduating class. In addition, approximately eight out of ten first-time full-time degree-seeking freshmen were in the top half of their graduating class.

## 18. RETENTION – First-time, Full-time degree-seeking freshmen

Seventy-one percent of **first-time, full-time degree-seeking freshmen** who enrolled in Fall 2005 returned to UMKC in Fall 2006.
