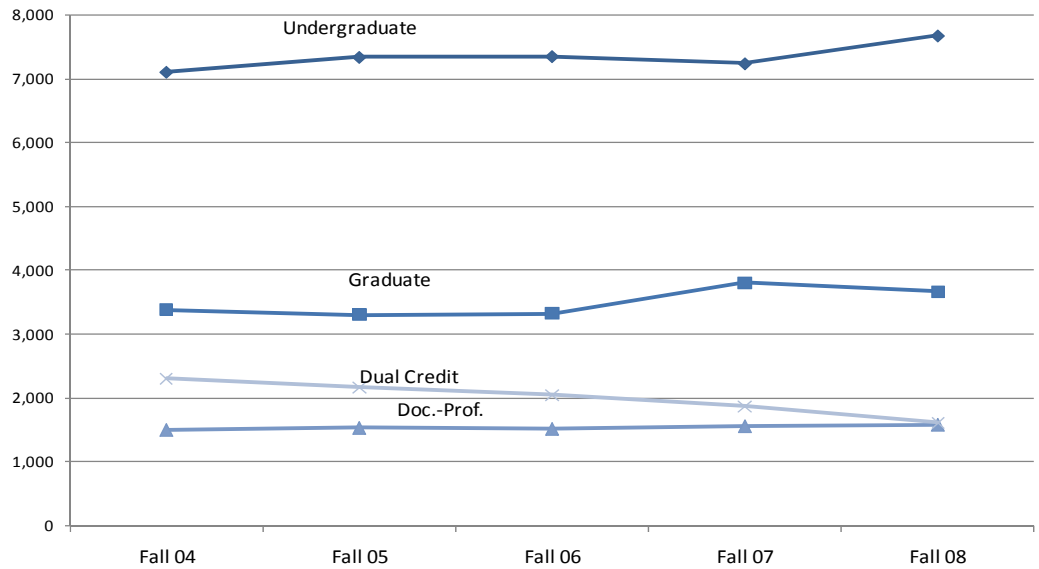

FALL HEADCOUNT

Total Fall 2008 headcount enrollment was 14,499. This was an overall increase of 1.7% from Fall 2004.

Note: In Fall 2007 students enrolled in August intersession began to be included in Fall headcounts. These students were primarily at the graduate level.

FULL-TIME EQUIVALENTS

Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) is defined by the Missouri Coordinating Board for Higher Education as 15 semester credit hours for undergraduate students, 12 semester credit hours for graduate students, and 15 semester credit hours for doctoral-professional law students. FTE is equivalent to headcount for doctoral-professional students in Dentistry, Medicine, and Pharmacy.

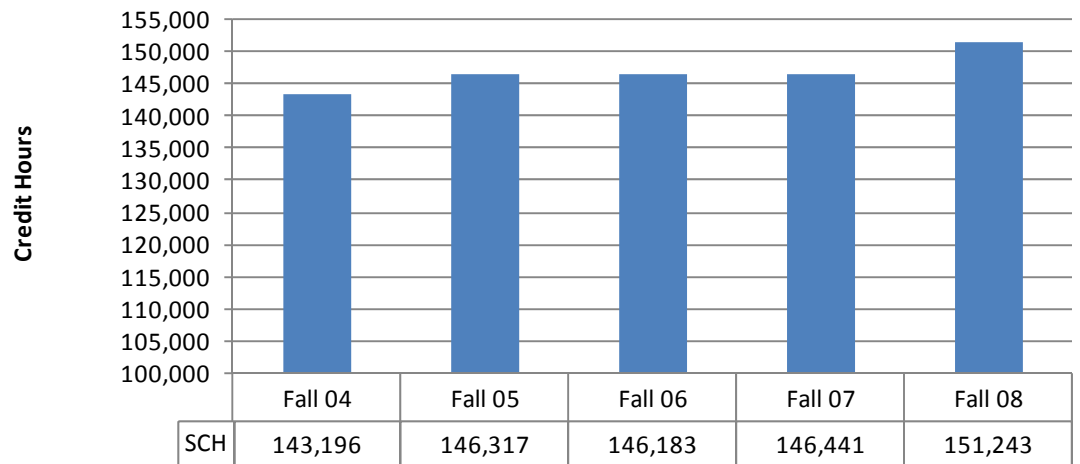

TOTAL CREDIT HOUR PRODUCTION

Credit hour production has remained steady during the last several years, but 2008 indicates a greater increase than previous years. UMKC produced 151,243 student credit hours in Fall 2008, an increase of 5.6% from Fall 2004.

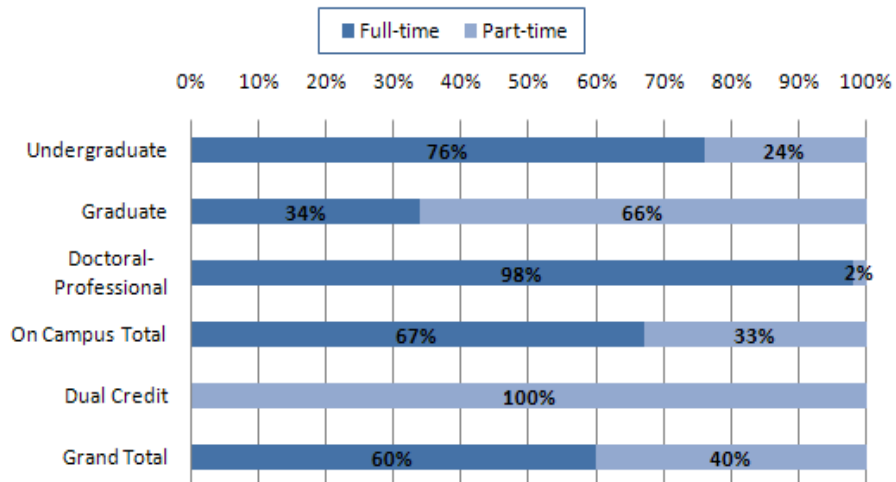

FULL- AND PART-TIME STATUS – FALL 2008

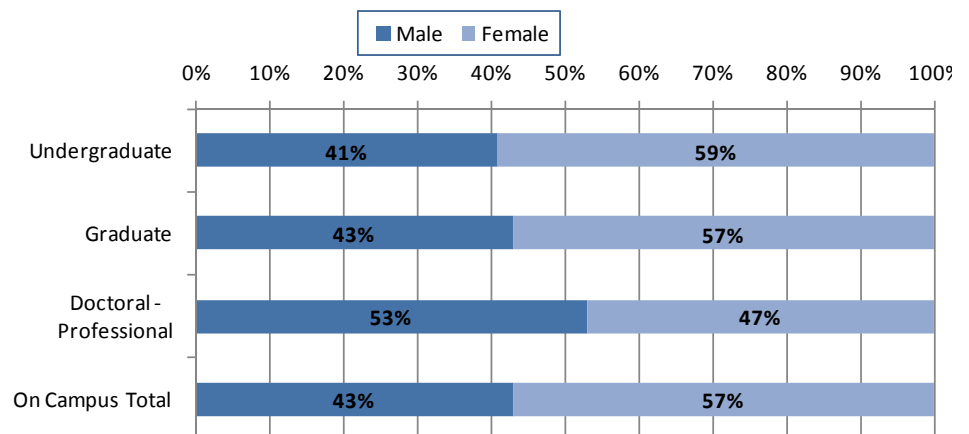
Sixty-seven percent of UMKC on-campus students (excludes dual credit students) were enrolled full-time in Fall 2008, though full-time status varies by level.

For purposes of calculating full-time status, undergraduate students must be enrolled in at least 12 credits and graduate students must be enrolled in at least 9 credits. Doctoral-professional credit thresholds vary by program.



GENDER – FALL 2008

In Fall 2008, 57% of UMKC's on-campus students were female and 43% were male. UMKC enrolled more females than males at the undergraduate and graduate levels. The doctoral-professional level, however, contains more males.



AGE BY LEVEL – FALL 2008

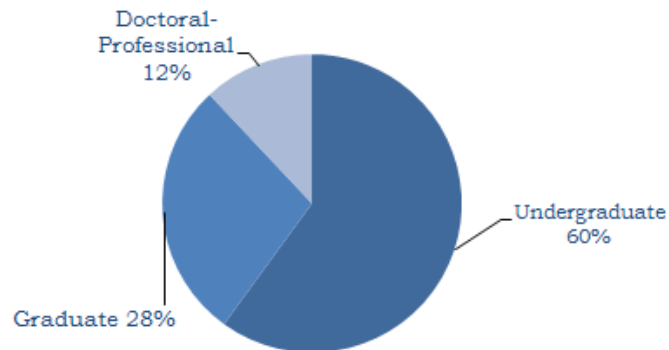
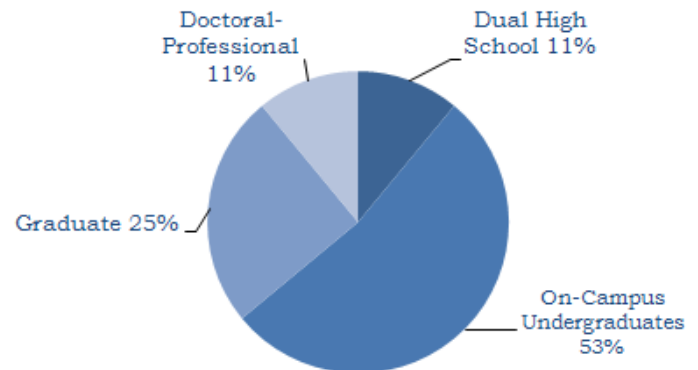
The table below shows the age distribution for UMKC students for Fall 2008. The average age for UMKC's total on-campus student body is 26. When dual credit students are included the average age is 25.

ENROLLMENT BY LEVEL – FALL 2008

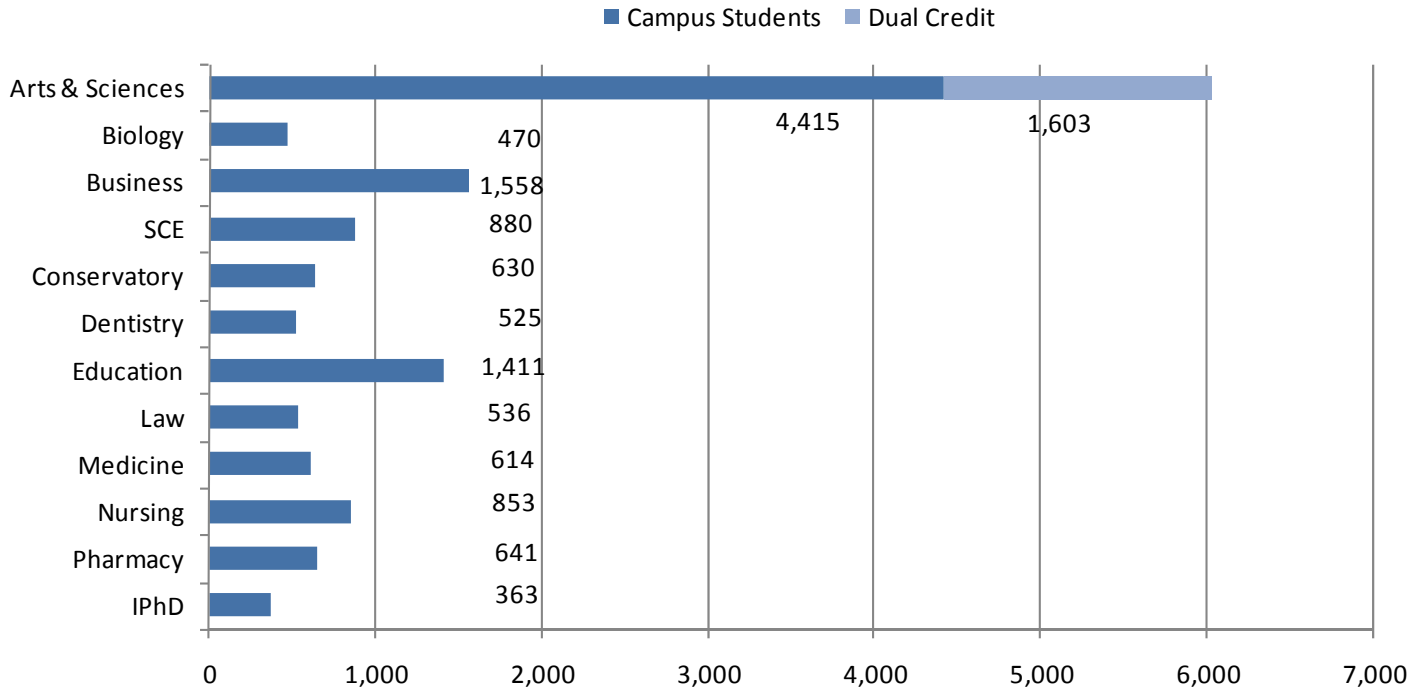
In Fall 2008, 11% of UMKC students were enrolled at the dual credit high school level, 53% were enrolled at the on-campus undergraduate level, 25% were enrolled at the graduate level, and 11% were enrolled at the doctoral-professional level. Doctoral-professional programs include Dentistry, Law, Medicine, and Pharmacy.

When dual credit high school students are excluded, enrollments are 60% undergraduate, 28% graduate, and 12% doctoral-professional.



ENROLLMENT BY ACADEMIC UNIT – FALL 2008

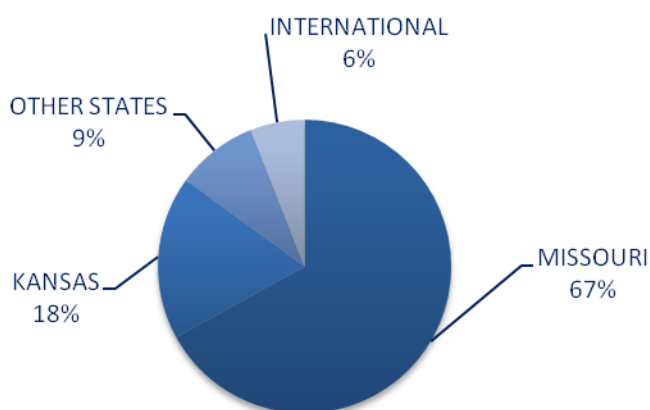
The Fall 2008 headcount by academic unit is presented in the graph below. The largest academic unit is Arts & Sciences with a total of 6,018 students, including the 1,603 dual credit high school students.



STATE OF ORIGIN – FALL 2008

In Fall 2008 Missouri residents represented 67% of the on-campus population. Another 18% were from Kansas, 9% were from other states, and 6% were international.

Note: Dual credit students are not included in the on-campus population.



KANSAS METRO COUNTIES – FALL 2008

In Fall 2002 UMKC began charging undergraduate students from the Kansas Metro Counties the same educational fees as Missouri students. In Fall 2008 UMKC on-campus undergraduate enrollment from these counties was at its highest level. Undergraduate enrollment from the Kansas Metro Counties has grown by 51% from Fall 2002 to Fall 2008.

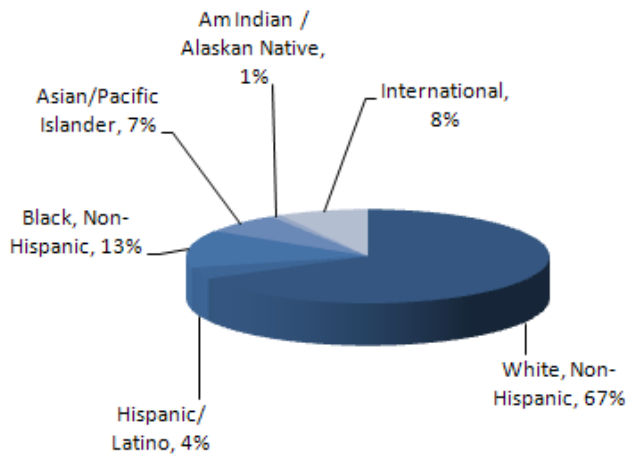

UMKC's on-campus minority* population is 25%.

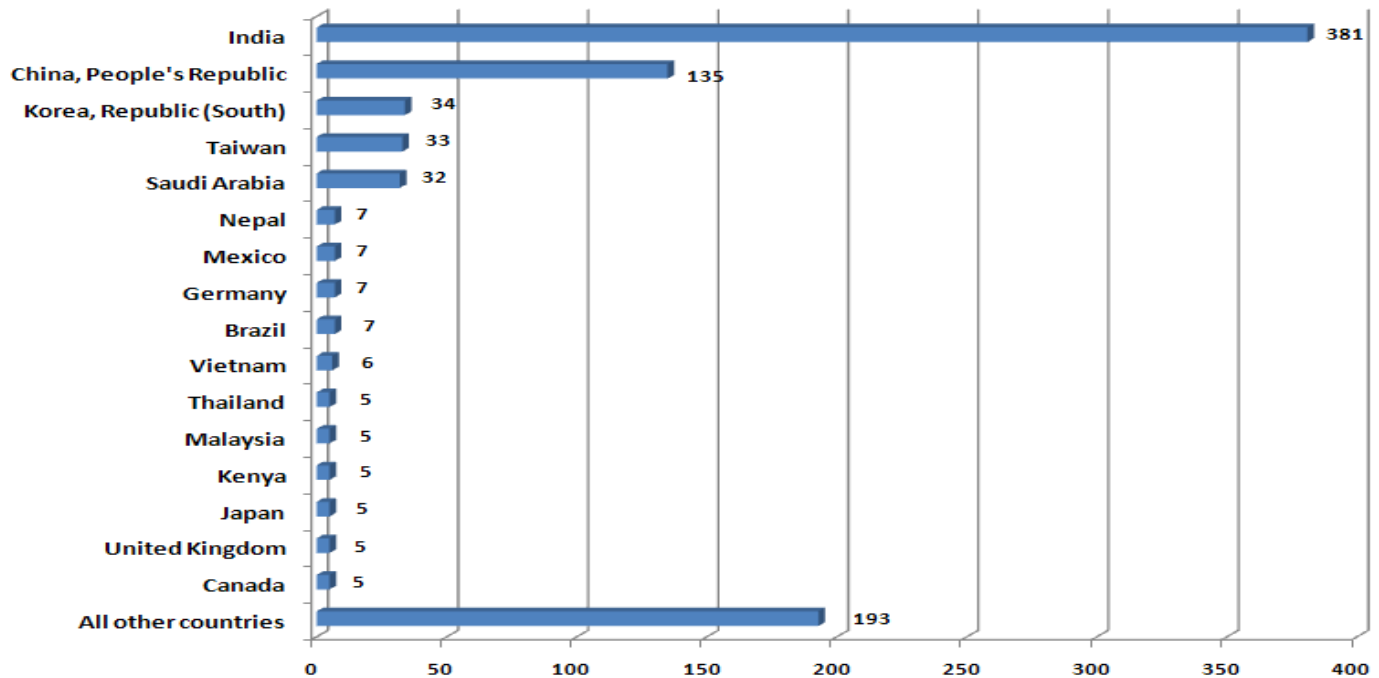
The percentages included in this figure are calculated based on the Fall 2008 on-campus enrollment where ethnicity is known.

*Minority includes Asian/Pacific Islander, American Indian/Alaskan Native, Hispanic/Latino, and Black Non-Hispanic.



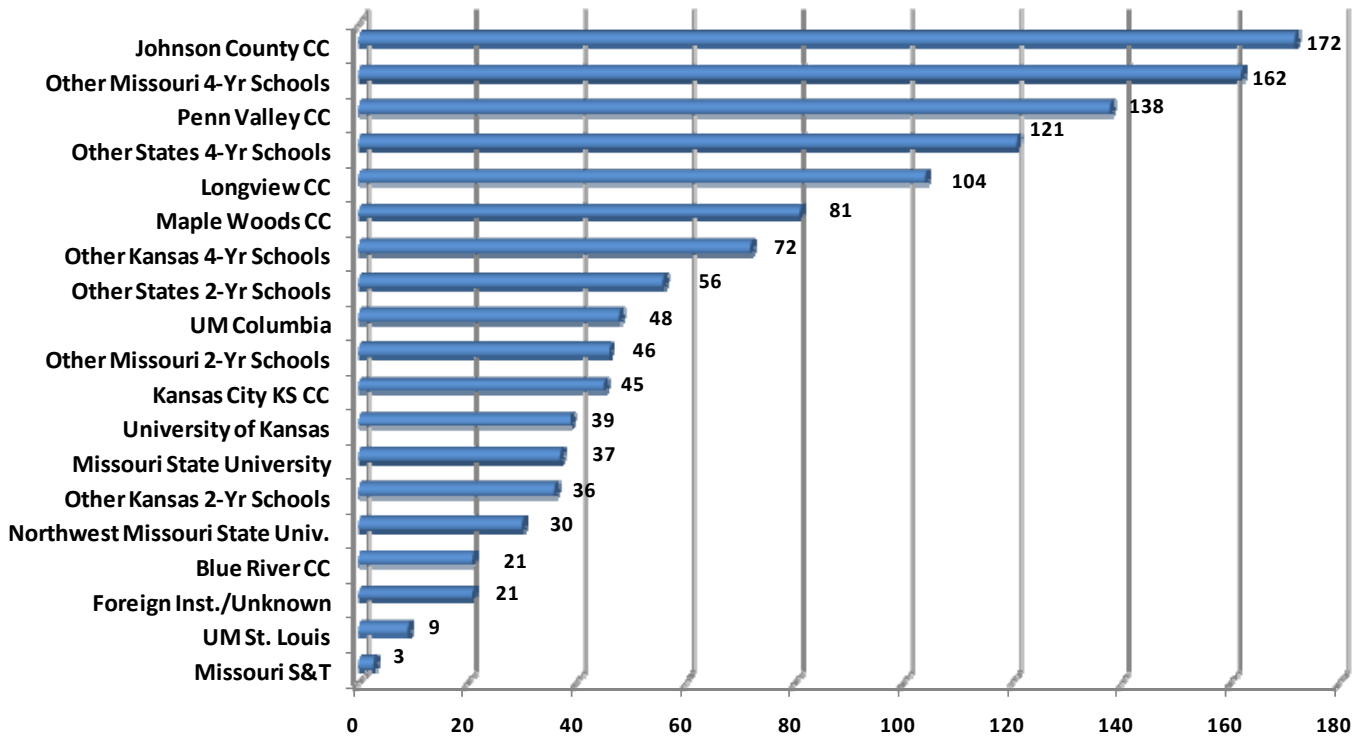
INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS – FALL 2008

A total of 872 degree-seeking, on-campus international students enrolled at UMKC in Fall 2008, representing 58 countries. The international student enrollment represents 8% of UMKC's overall on-campus population. The figure below shows all countries represented by at least five students at UMKC.



TRANSFER INSTITUTIONS – FALL 2008

The majority of new undergraduates at UMKC transfer from other institutions. There were a total of 1,241 new undergraduate transfer students in Fall 2008. Of those, 679 transferred from Missouri colleges and universities and 562 transferred from other states and countries.



Note: Individual institutions are reported above for all UM System institutions, Metropolitan Community Colleges (MCC), and those with 30 or more transfer students entering in Fall 2008.

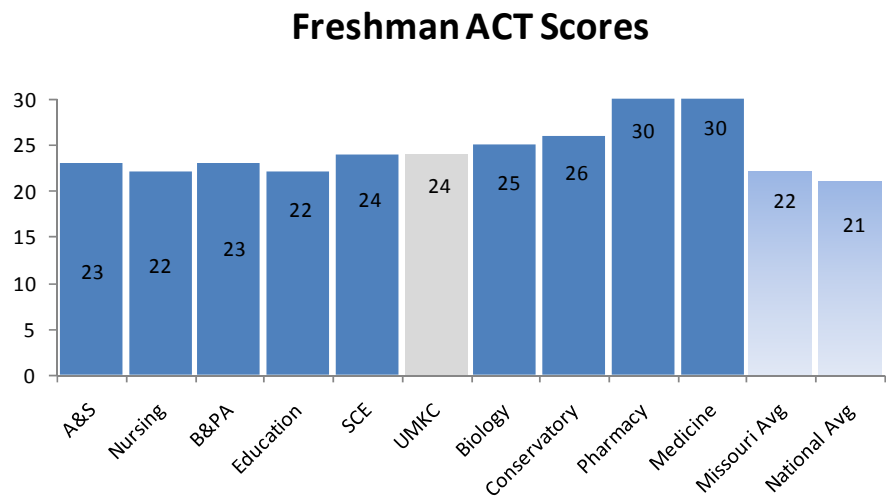
FRESHMAN ACT SCORES – FALL 2008

A total of 974 first-time, full-time degree-seeking freshman students entered in Fall 2008. Of these, 903 reported their ACT score to UMKC.

The average ACT score* for UMKC is 24. UMKC students performed above the Missouri average of 22 and the national average of 21.

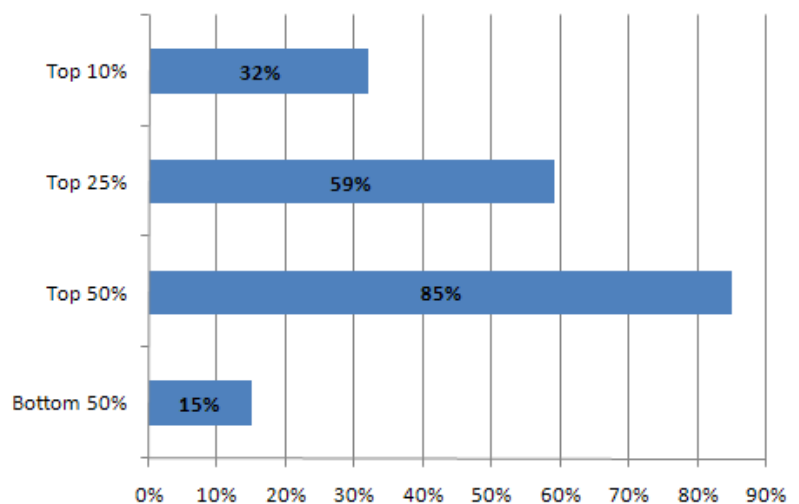

FRESHMAN HIGH SCHOOL RANK – FALL 2008

Of the 974 first-time, full-time degree-seeking freshmen, 632 reported their high school rank to UMKC. Over half of the freshmen were in the top 25% of their graduating class. In addition, approximately eight out of ten first-time, full-time degree-seeking freshmen were in the top half of their graduating class.



EDUCATIONAL & REQUIRED FEES

The 2008-2009 academic year educational and required fees are provided below. Tuition for undergraduate enrollment is \$245.60 per credit hour and graduate tuition is \$298.70 per credit hour. Professional program fees are provided as a flat rate by program.

RETENTION – 2000-2008

In addition, UMKC transitioned to PeopleSoft during the 2007-2008 academic year. During the transition, data were cleaned and moved to the new system and may have altered previous results.
