 - i. Over 400 students enrolled in Honors College, tripled since 2015, widely distributed in all colleges/schools, about 1/3 of faculty engaged in Honors College, 400 students have been admitted for the fall, committed to a diverse Honors College student body
 - 1. Some undergraduates in Law/Medicine courses
 - c. Many ways for Faculty to be involved in the Honors College

- i. How many Honors credits do you need?
 - 1. Depends on transfer credits. Either 21 or 27.
- ii. What's the difference between Honors credit and regular credit?
 - 1. Generally a special project/extra work, or an honors course
- iii. Benefits to the Honors College?
 - 1. More advising, extended check-out privileges, property enrollment, Living Learning community, Academic/Social events a few times a month
- iv. Compare with KU?
 - 1. Honors College is a more comprehensive experience. 24/7 network. MU is our nearest peer program.
- v. Do we need to bring a new course, or courses that already exist?
 - 1. Courses that already exist. Normal courses need an honors project.
- vi. Are you showcased in recruitment effort for UMKC?
 - 1. Meet with recruitment every year. Applicants who meet the criteria will be nudged to join.
- vii. If I wanted to cross list courses with Honors Courses, what standard are in place?
 - 1. Honors students would sign up for the Honors section, Honors students would work on a collaborative project to earn the honors credit.
