

- Develop a veteran, urban, organic, and sustainable program that can be replicated at future VCP locations





Participant Expectations

- Wear your Chow Hall Farms shirt while at the farm.
- Treat everyone with respect and dignity.
- Shifts will be scheduled and notice provided by JD.
- 4. If you cannot make a shift, you must email or text JD as soon as possible and provide rationale as to why you cannot attend. This rationale helps us code your absence. No calls, no shows moving forward may lead to immediate dismissal from the program.
- 5. Shifts missed will need to be made up either that same week or the week following and scheduled with JD. It is at JD's discretion if a shift is allowed to be missed and not made up based upon the workload at the farm each week.
- 6. Being on time for your shift is required.

STIPEND REVIEW



STIPEND REVIEW & PAPERWORK

- Your time is valuable = compensation
- ► Each veteran participant will receive a \$4,000 stipend
- Quarterly payments will be sent the week of the following:
 - October 1
 - January 1
 - ► April 1
 - August 1
- Continued participation is required for stipend payments
