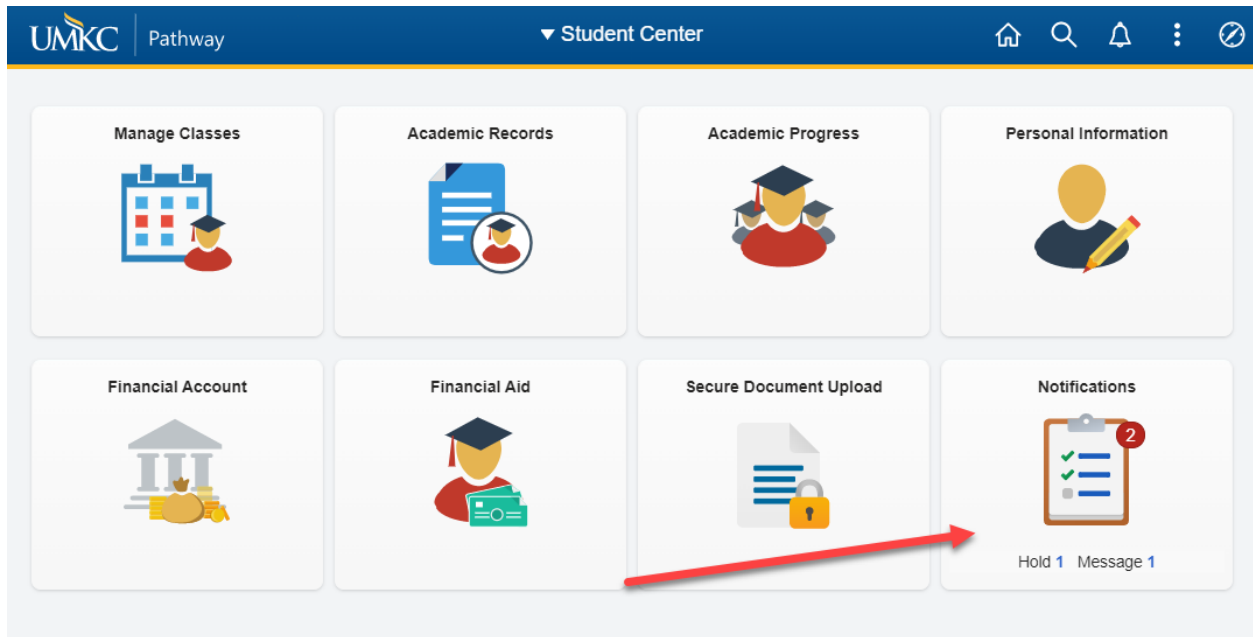
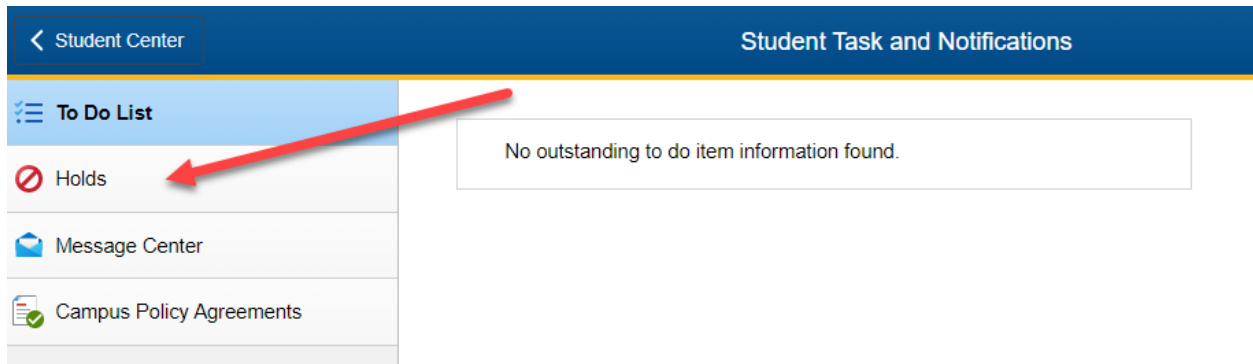


# Viewing your Holds in Pathway
